In 2010 transitioned campus recycling to single stream, allowing for significant increase in materials recycled, and in 2011 assumed responsibility for the university surplus program, making substantial improvements and increasing surplus reuse.
- Led a collaborative team in the creation a comprehensive campus Energy Policy, and partner with Energy Management on initiatives resulting in substantial reductions in campus energy use, such as the annual winter "Conservation Vacation", and "Reduce Your Use" energy conservation competition between residence halls.

Advise and collaborate on research projects and development of sustainability policies and initiatives. Conduct a bi-annual Greenhouse Gas Emissions inventory for Scope 1 and 2 emissions related to university energy and fuel use (built environment and vehicle fleet), agricultural practices, and solid waste. Assist with LEED crediting for new buildings. Produce an annual WKU Sustainability Report. Conduct data collection and report for AASHE STARS bi-annually. Develop educational and awareness materials and outreach programs. Provide a clearinghouse of information and resources. Created and maintain WKU Sustainability website and social media. Train and coordinate student interns and volunteers. Oversee the campus recycling program since 2007 and surplus program since 2011. Oversee the Big Red Bike bicycle lending library. Instruct courses including MBA Sustainability Business Metrics and other courses for the Institute for Citizenship and

Social Responsibility. Advise student organizations including GreenToppers and Americans for an Informed Democracy (AID).

- In 2011 assumed supervision of the university surplus program, with the goal of increasing re-use of surplus items by adding talented staff and expanded services. In first year, created *TopperTrader*, an on-line catalog of surplus items, a surplus sales eBay site, and computer donation program, realizing savings of \$78,000 in 2011/2012 through surplus re-use on campus.
- Plan and execute campus sustainability events, including nationally recognized guest speakers, an annual Earth Day Festival, and other special events.
- Chair the WKU Sustainability Committee, comprised of 14 faculty, staff and administrators appointed by the university President.
- Manage the 1.5 acre Student Garden at the WKU Farm.
- Co-authored two externally funded grant proposals in 2012: the first proposal to the Commonwealth of KY (funding by TVA) in collaboration with Parking and Transportation Services and the Center for Research and Development for alternative energy research and application, the second proposal to the USDA in collaboration with the Agriculture Department and the Community Farmers' Market for Farmers' Market development.
- WKU has been included in Princeton Review's Guide to Green Colleges in 2010, 2011 and 2012, as a result of the continually improving sustainability program.
- Obtaining funding from, and serve as lead stakeholder for, the Alliance to Save Energy/TVA PowerSave Campus program which employs student interns to work on energy education and efficiency on campus.
